Todd Moss, former Deputy Assistant Secretary of State under Condoleezza Rice, is now senior fellow at the <u>Center for Global Development</u> and a nonresident scholar at the <u>Center for Energy Studies</u> at Rice University's Baker Institute. His research focuses on U.S.-Africa relations, energy policy, and private investment. Todd previously worked at Georgetown University, the London School of Economics, and the World Bank. He's the author of <u>African Development: Making Sense of the Issues and Actors</u> (2011) and <u>Oil to Cash: Fighting the Resource Curse with Cash Transfers</u> (2015). Todd has a PhD from the University of London's SOAS and a BA from Tufts University. Todd is also the author of the <u>Judd Ryker international thriller series from Penguin's Putnam Books</u> about a State Department crisis manager, including <u>The Golden Hour</u> (2014), <u>Minute Zero</u> (2015), <u>Ghosts of Havana</u> (2016), and <u>The Shadow List</u>(2017)
