Day 1: Wednesday, October 1st, 2025

Depart from Charlotte-Douglas International Airport via American Airlines from Charlotte, connecting to Iberia Airlines in Madrid, then departing for Porto, where you will arrive the next morning (overnight flight). **Time-appropriate meals and in-flight services will be provided.**

Day 2: Thursday, October 2nd, 2025

You will arrive in Porto mid-morning and be welcomed to the vibrant and historic city of Portugal. After clearing Portuguese customs, you will meet our expert tour guide and old friend, Stefan Aquelino, who has traveled with us a few times. He will aid in your transfer to your hotel.

For the next three nights, you'll stay at <u>the Yeatman</u> <u>Hotel</u>, in Porto, a luxury wine hotel and spa with spectacular views of the UNESCO World Heritage City and the Douro River. The cellars of the Yeatman house one of the most comprehensive collections of Portuguese wines. The hotel partners with many of Portugal's finest producers, which sponsor individual rooms where intriguing pictures and objects provide insights into each winery's unique history and add a

discreet, individual accent to each room.

"The Yeatmans, who entered the Port trade in 1838, were among the most distinguished and enterprising of the Port families. Their descendants maintain this tradition as owners of three of the most famous Port companies.

In 2006 the opportunity arose for another high-profile project, a landmark luxury hotel in a stunning location overlooking the historic centre of Oporto. Named The Yeatman, in celebration of the family's historic link with the city, it draws on its owners' expertise in both fine wine production and luxury hotel management to become one of the world's leading wine hotels.

Opened since August 2010, it became Porto's address of choice, the hotel that defines the city." (Source: The Yeatman Hotel website)

Take some time to settle in and recover from the trans-Atlantic journey.

In the late afternoon, after your free time, join your group to tour the iconic 300-year-old <u>Taylor's Wine</u> <u>Cellar</u>, dedicated entirely to the production of Port wine. This is followed by a tasting of three wines. Enjoy your welcome dinner at the <u>Barao de Fladgate</u> in a spectacular location on the grounds of the Taylor's Wine Cellar (both the Taylor's Wine Cellar and the restaurant are right next door to the Yeatman Hotel).

Day 3: Friday, October 3rd, 2025

Porto/Douro Valley

Breakfast is included at the hotel.

After breakfast overlooking the city, you'll set out on a full-day tour of the Douro Valley with a local guide. You'll begin touring by motorcoach through the Douro Wine Region Valley, the oldest demarcated wine region in the world. Driving along the Douro River, past picturesque viewpoints and through charming villages, you'll admire the breathtaking landscapes and vistas.

Stop in the village of Cambres at the Quinta da Pacheca, one of the prestigious and recognized wineries in the Douro Region, dating back to the 16th century, an incredible property of over 75 hectares of vineyards. Here, a locally sourced **lunch is included** as you enjoy a winery tour.

After lunch, proceed to probably the most picturesque village in the Douro Valley, Pinhao where we board a private 1-hour cruise on the Douro on a Rabelo boat, a traditional Portuguese wooden boat used for centuries to transport people and cargo on the Douro River.

As you head back to Porto, your final stop will be at the <u>Quinta do Seixo</u>, dating back to the 17th century, to enjoy a tour and tasting while enjoying the magnificent landscape.

"It occupies the spurs and slopes of a mountain, one side of which bounds the Douro, and the other the Rio Torto valley. Scattered over the heights above are the white cottages of the village of Valença, the vineyards of which produce a considerable quantity of first-class wine. The buildings of the Quinta do Seixo, which are entered through an imposing gateway, surmounted by the armorial bearings of its owner, are very extensive. The casa is both commodious and well arranged, and has a certain air of pretension about it, while the lagares and the adega are on a scale proportionate to the extent of the surrounding vineyard." Once back in Porto and at The Yeatman, enjoy an independent evening and dinner. Perhaps you might want to try the <u>Yeatman Gastronomic Restaurant</u> with 2 Michelin Stars.

Day 4: Saturday, October 4th, 2025

Breakfast is included at the hotel.

This morning, you will depart from your hotel and embark on another full-day excursion to Braga and Guimaraes Castle. As you venture out of Porto, you will begin your scenic journey with Braga, the religious power center since the 6th century.

Braga is the oldest city in Portugal and one of the world's oldest catholic cities. Highlights of the visit include the <u>Braga Cathedral</u>, the oldest cathedral in Portugal and the <u>Bom Jesus do Monte</u>, a notable example of a Christian pilgrimage site with a monumental stairway that climbs up about 381 feet. The stairway has 17 landings and you are welcome to climb it or you can take the Elevador de Bom Jesus.

Lunch is included at a local restaurant as a group.

After lunch, you will embark to the medieval city of Guimarães and the 10th century <u>Guimarães Castle</u> with its sweeping views of the area. Guimarães is a beautiful city generally regarded as the birthplace of Portugal and the castle is considered one of the most iconic in appearance in the world.

"The Guimarães Castle is widely recognized as the closest one to the origins of Portugal and it presents a surprising infrastructure on many levels. First of all due to its origins, which are singularly unclear. It is safe to say that we are dealing with a count's edifice, fruit of the charismatic Countess of Portucale Mumadona. As the castle is not

mentioned in a detailed document, dated of 950, that divided goods between the Countess and her children, we can conclude that, at that time, it did not yet exist. But by the end of that year, the castle is mentioned in a donation to the Guimarães Monastery. Hence, it is recognized as of count's foundation in the second half of the 10th century. Countess Mumadona herself declared, in a parchment dated of 968, that she had the castle built in order to protect the previously mentioned Monastery against "Gentile" attacks (referring probably to the Normans). This primitive castle, embedded within the granite outcrops, was probably made out of wood and there are few traces left of it."

Afterwards, the group will return to Porto for another free evening and dinner on your own. There are so many fine restaurants to choose from in the city.

Day 5: Sunday, October 5th, 2025

Breakfast is included at the hotel.

Following your final breakfast at the Yeatman Hotel, you will journey through the city of Porto with a local guide. Your excursion will include wine-tasting and time for a lovely independent lunch. After lunch, you will continue to <u>Aveiro</u>, the Venice of Portugal, due to its canals navigated by colorful Moliceiro Boats (much like Venetian gondolas) used to transport seaweed for fertilizer.

Enjoy a short cruise on one of these magnificent local boats, followed by a city tour of Aveiro.

"Aveiro has a number of buildings in Art Nouveau style that are worth seeing. Many are situated along the main channel, but there are some off the beaten track and in other locations. The location of the buildings is indicated in a guide available at the Tourist Office and you can get to know this style even better in the Museum dedicated to it." (Source: Visit Portugal)

A highlight of your day will be a dessert workshop where you will make and enjoy the local Portuguese pastry delicacy, Ovos Moles de Aveiro.

You will then head back to your new hotel that you will stay at for one night, the centrally located and historic <u>MS Collection Aveiro Palacete de</u> <u>Valdemouro</u>, where we will enjoy an included group dinner.

Day 6: Monday, October 6th, 2025

Aveiro/Coimbra/Óbidos/ Santarem/Lisbon

Breakfast is included at the hotel.

After breakfast at the hotel, we will have a full day of historic and charming towns enroute to Lisbon. The first stop is Coimbra, the former capital and the home to a preserved medieval old town and one of the oldest universities in Europe. There, you will enjoy a guided tour including entrance to the baroque library, the <u>Biblioteca Joanina</u>.

"The Baroque Library is the best example of Portuguese Baroque and is considered to be one of the richest European libraries. It is also known as the Joanina Library in honour and memory of King John V, who authorised its construction and whose portrait, painted by Domenico Duprà, distinctly dominates the space inside the Noble Floor.

Construction on the Baroque Library was completed in 1728. It functioned as the University Library from 1777 until the first half of the 20th century.

It holds 60 thousand books, dating from the 16th century to the 18th century, on a wide variety of topics that can still be consulted today." <u>(Source:</u> <u>University of Coimbra)</u>

Afterwards, there is time for an independent lunch and exploration around the town. The group will then head to Óbidos, one of the most Instagrammable and arguably the most beautiful cities in Portugal. There will be time for independent exploration through the cobblestone streets and a visit to the <u>Óbidos Castle</u>. This is the place to enjoy a Ginjinha, a cherry-flavored

digestif that is often served in a chocolate cup.

The final pitstop will be in the town of Santarem, the most Gothic town in Portugal. This is where you once again have time to independently explore the beauty the town has to offer.

Late that afternoon, you will arrive at the largest city in Portugal and its capital, Lisbon. You will head to your hotel for the next two nights, the <u>Four Seasons</u> <u>Hotel Ritz Lisbon</u>, a luxurious 5 star hotel in the center of Lisbon.

After time to freshen up, you will join the group for a delicious dinner at the hotel.

Lisbon is known for its food and restaurants, so the morning will be devoted to a three-hour walking tour of its local markets and local restaurants with a sampling of Portuguese favorites such as a pork sandwich with beer,

"The Belém Tower, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is one of Lisbon's most striking monuments and the icon of a country historically moulded by its proximity to the ocean and its maritime discoveries of new worlds." <u>Read More</u>

After your tour, you will return to the hotel in the late afternoon for an independent dinner and evening. There are numerous excellent restaurants to try. The hotel concierge can offer some recommendations to assist you. Additionally, this is a wonderful opportunity to experience Fado, Portugal's traditional music - <u>listen here</u>.

Today, you will depart from Lisbon and head southeast towards the sunny coast, the Algarve, Portugal's southernmost region.

As you travel through Portugal's agricultural center with its groves of olives, citrus, and cork groves, you will discover beautiful gems along the way. Your first stop is Évora, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, due to its Roman and Moorish

past. There, you will enjoy a guided tour including a <u>Roman</u> <u>temple</u>, the <u>12th-century cathedral</u>, and <u>Giraldo Square</u>.

"Judging by the calm, welcoming surroundings, one easily sees why this city, which dates from the Roman era, was chosen by the kings of Portugal in the 15th century to serve as their residence, a fact that contributed to its development and cultural importance in the following centuries. It was in fact due to Évora's long history and its urban centre, typical of the 16th to 18th centuries, that has been preserved to our days that lead UNESCO to classify the city as a World Heritage site." 
You will have time for an independent lunch before you continue on your journey. The next stop is <u>Beja</u>, which is situated on a 900 ft. hill with commanding views over the vast plains of the Baixo Alentejo.

"The lovely city of Beja just oozes charm. Its cobblestone streets haphazardly lead in many different directions, much worse than in Boston. Who would have thought that was even possible? Fortunately, in Beja, you can WALK everywhere—to work assignments, to dinner, for coffee, to the bus station, to its many attractions." (Source: Destination Now)

After some independent free time to explore the beauty Beja has to offer, you will arrive in Faro, the group's next hub. You will stay at the <u>Pousada Palacio de Estoi</u>, a restored 18th-century palace, for the next three nights.

In the afternoon, you will enjoy a tour in <u>Praia da Rocha</u>, a charming beach town and <u>Carvoeiro</u>, another lovely coastal gem.

On your way back to Faro, you will venture to the charming town of Almancil and its spectacular church, the <u>Igreja de</u> <u>São Lourenço</u>. This church is one of the Algarve's main cultural treasures.

"Built in 1730, it miraculously survived the Great Earthquake

While it looks like an ordinary Portuguese church from outside, its interior is an outstanding example of European baroque and tile art, and considered a masterpiece of Portuguese art." Journey through Ribeira Brava and Paul de Serra to the island's western side via off-road paths with time to enjoy the natural pools at Porto Moniz.

There, you will have time to discover the scenic valleys, mountains, plateaus and coastal landscapes of the island's Southwest Region. Additionally, while there you will have time for an independent lunch.
